UPDATE ON OUR CAPITAL WORKS UPGRADE

As you would most likely be aware, in November last year it was announced by the State Government that we were successful in achieving funding for a \$10 million dollar upgrade that would include an ecocabin and new toilet block for Senior Students.

Over the Summer holidays and since then, there has been a lot of activity as part of the upgrade process.

The School has completed the Asset Management Plan Phase 1 which outlines the specific characteristics of the school, its learning, teaching and curriculum models and the programs and operational structures that we will take forward into the future. There has been a process to appoint Gray Puksand as the successful architects for the project.

This term there are many meetings being conducted with the architects and over the coming months designs will be produced and start to take shape. Construction is expected to start early in 2022. It is a very exciting time for our school and I will update you further as we progress.

Student School Attendance

Daily school attendance of your child is a legal government requirement. In Victoria, it is compulsory for children and young people aged 6–17 years to attend school.

Parents are legally required to ensure their child attends school every day and to provide an explanation for their child's absence from school unless an exemption from attendance has been granted or an exception to their attendance applies.

If your child/ren are unable to attend school due to illness or medical appointments, please assist the school by logging onto the Sentral For Parents app or contact the school directly by phoning the office on 9705 3800 as soon as possible.

Generally, schools advise against planning a family holiday in term time. If your family are going away on holidays outside of the set term holiday periods, you must advise the school prior to the leave occurring to apply for this leave. Preferred method is by completing a future absence request on the Sentral For Parents App. Otherwise, leave slips can be located in the office. Please note that any leave taken less than 5 days will not be classed as holiday leave and will be noted as parent choice and not authorised by the school.

The Social and Emotional Benefit of On-Time Regular Attendance

Students at Strathaird Primary School are required to be at school no later than 8:50am to start their day.

At the period of life when young children are moving from the home environment into the broader community of school, there are significant benefits from consistent, on-time school attendance.

*Sleeping and eating patterns are stabilised with good effects on health.

*A predictable schedule builds the child's confidence at home and school.

*Children know what to expect in the classroom because they were there the previous day.

*Children recognise they are part of a community; their peers and teacher expect and include them and miss them when they are gone.

*Ongoing, extended conversations and learning are able to be built upon.

*Children learn to increasingly control their emotions simply by being in a consistent environment and on schedule every day.

*Teachers spend less time "catching them up" and more time building on what they learned the day before.

*Parents and families feel more a part of the school community and are able to support and engage with each other.

Early Student Pickup

Our school day finishes at 3:15am each day unless otherwise advised. It's extremely important the students are given the opportunity to complete their full day of school with little to no disruption. Where possible, we ask that parents arrange appointments outside of school hours. Where early pick up of a student is required, please notify the school ahead of time. When arriving, please allow extra time so we are able to organise your child to be brought to the office. Please consider avoiding break times and assembly times when students will not be in their classrooms.

The Sentral for Parents app allows families to:

- explain past and upcoming student absences
- view calendar events

Instructions for accessing the Sentral for Parent App

1. **Download** the 'Sentral for Parents' app. Depending on your device, visit either the Apple App Store, or the Google Play Store.

2. Search for Strathaird Primary School. Tap Next.

3. **Sign in** using your Sentral username (your registered email address) and password (that you created when Registering). Tap Log In.

4. You are now ready to start using the app.

If you have never registered on Sentral:

1.Click register here to register a new account. It will ask you to create a user name and password. Enter your email address as your username and create your own password. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified in order to continue.

2. Once verified, log back into the app and use the access key provided by the school to link to your child's details. *The access key will be created for you once your child is attending*.

Cyberbullying: the new Children's eSafety Commissioner

The Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner (the Office) was established on 1 July 2015 to handle complaints about cyberbullying material targeted at Australian children.

The Office can investigate complaints about material considered likely to have a seriously threatening, intimidating, harassing or humiliating effect on the child. Where possible, the material should be reported to the social media service first, before it is complained about to the Office. To consider a complaint the Office will need evidence of the cyberbullying material.

Parents, along with schools and the government have a role in ensuring children are protected online. The Office will work with social media services, parents and schools to ensure serious cyberbullying material is removed.

What to do if your child is being cyberbullied

If your child is being cyberbullied advise them to:

- avoid retaliating or responding
- collect the evidence—keep mobile phone messages and print emails or social networking conversations
- block the bully and change their privacy settings
- report the abuse to the social media service

If your child continues to be cyberbullied and you believe it is having a seriously threatening, intimidating, harassing or humiliating effect, we encourage you to assist your child in <u>making a</u> <u>complaint</u> on the Commissioner's website.

The <u>Kids Helpline</u> provides a private and confidential, telephone and online counselling service for young people.
