PARENT OPINION SURVEY

Rubbish Free lunch food ideas

Some recipe ideas for lunch boxes (trialled with kids!)

Caramel Biscuits

Baking at home is not only cheaper and healthier but also children learn about Maths and Literacy through engaging with a recipe. It also significantly cuts down the amount of packaging used so is better for the environment.

This is a super easy biscuit recipe my kids love to make themselves. It uses minimal ingredients and you can even make the golden syrup yourself if keen. they are great to replace packaged biscuits in the lunchbox.

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 Tbs golden syrup
- 1 cup SR flour (or gluten free SR flour)

Method

- 1. Cream butter and sugar add syrup and beat until fluffy.
- 2. mix in flour until you are able to make it into balls
- 3. place small balls of mixture on a lined baking tray and gently press down with a fork.
- 5. Bake at 180 degrees for 15 minutes.



VICTORIAN PREMIERS' READING CHALLENGE



The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge has been running again throughout this year. Students have been completing lots of reading both at school and while at home. They are encouraged to enter the books they have completed before the 17th September, when the challenge concludes. Your child should have received their login details earlier this year for access to the VPRC website. Login instructions are attached below help students and families to access the website and add the required number of books. If you can not find or remember your login details, please request them from your child's teacher.

Challenge Rules for Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students:

Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students are required to read or experience 30 books. 20 books will need to be found on the PRC list and 10 books can be choice books, you can check how many of each you have when you visit your child's dashboard online.



How to login:

- 1.Click the link above to visit the PRC website.
- 2.Click 'school/student' (top right-hand side)
- 3.Inside the Student Login box, click 'VPRC login'.
- 4. Type your username and password and click 'login'.
- 5. You should now see your personal dashboard.

You can enter all of the books that you have read with your child since school began earlier this year. Now, there's no need to worry! Your child's teacher will be adding many wonderful books that they have been reading to the whole class throughout the year. However, we also welcome you to add any extra beautiful stories that you have spent time reading at home if you wish to enter them online. Thank you to those parents who have already jumped onto the website to begin the challenge for 2021.

Challenge Rules for Grade 3-6 students:

Grade 3 to Grade 6 students are required to read 15 books before the 17th September (end of Term 3). 10 books will need to be found on the PRC list and 5 books can be choice books, your child can check how many of each they have when visiting their dashboard online. Students can enter all of the books that they have read, both at school and at home, since school began this year. To make it easier, they can simply use the titles that have been recorded in their home reading diary. Hopefully, your child has been able to spend some of their time relaxing with a good book while learning at home!

Cyberbullying: the new Children's eSafety Commissioner

The Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner (the Office) was established on 1 July 2015 to handle complaints about cyberbullying material targeted at Australian children.

The Office can investigate complaints about material considered likely to have a seriously threatening, intimidating, harassing or humiliating effect on the child. Where possible, the material should be reported to the social media service first, before it is complained about to the Office. To consider a complaint the Office will need evidence of the cyberbullying material.

Parents, along with schools and the government have a role in ensuring children are protected online. The Office will work with social media services, parents and schools to ensure serious cyberbullying material is removed.

What to do if your child is being cyberbullied

If your child is being cyberbullied advise them to:

- · avoid retaliating or responding
- collect the evidence—keep mobile phone messages and print emails or social networking conversations
- block the bully and change their privacy settings
- report the abuse to the social media service

If your child continues to be cyberbullied and you believe it is having a seriously threatening, intimidating, harassing or humiliating effect, we encourage you to assist your child in <u>making a complaint</u> on the Commissioner's website.

More information on the <u>role of the Office</u>, how to <u>deal with cyberbullying</u> and how to <u>lodge a complaint</u> is available on the website.

The <u>Kids Helpline</u> provides a private and confidential, telephone and online counselling service for young people. Encourage your child to speak to them if they are in need of counselling support. The Kids Helpline also manages <u>Parentline</u>, a confidential telephone counselling service providing counselling and support for parents and care-givers.

Sentral for Parents App

The **Sentral for Parents** app allows families to:

- → view academic reports
- → explain past and upcoming student absences
- view calendar events
- → book parent/teacher interviews
- receive sick bay notifications
- → view school newsletters

as well as receive real-time notifications and messages from the school.

Instructions for accessing the Sentral for Parent App

- 1. **Download** the 'Sentral for Parents' app. Depending on your device, visit either the Apple App Store, or the Google Play Store.
- 2. Search for Strathaird Primary School. Tap Next.
- 3. **Sign in** using your Sentral username (your registered email address) and password (that you created when Registering). Tap Log In.
- 4. You are now ready to start using the app.

If you have never registered on Sentral:

- 1.Click register here to register a new account. It will ask you to create a user name and password. Enter your email address as your username and create your own password. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified in order to continue.
- 2. Once verified, log back into the app and use the access key provided by the school to link to your child's details. The access key will be created for you once your child is attending.
