An analysis of the school's data identified a lower proportion of students demonstrating high growth in writing. The percentage of students in the top two bands in Year 3 were not retained into Year 5. Inconsistency in the development and implementation of student voice and agency in learning and wellbeing, specifically related to self-regulation in learning and the development of goals, success criteria and two-way feedback. Also a focus on student well being in terms of sense of confidence, perseverance, and resilience may benefit our students.
